

Non stop voyage around the world without assistance. Alessandro Di Benedetto leaves the Bay of Biscay and sails towards the Canary Islands

Sunday, November 1 st. 5p.m.

Alessandro Di Benedetto left the Bay of Biscay in spite of the weather conditions that were not suitable these past two days with wind, rain and a wavy sea that gave problems to Alessandro and his boat: Findomestic: *'The duel with Biscay is over. I am now sailing with wind abeam and cross wind, better points of sailing for the boat at 6 knots.'*

Alessandro is heading toward the Canary Islands. *'This night I didn't sleep at all because at Cape Finisterre where I am right now, the sea is well formed. Besides yesterday I was nearly rammed by a cargo that sailed only 100 meters from my boat. It is cold, the sky is black and I am a bit tired, I am impatient to arrive at the level of Canary Islands to have sun and be warm and above all to tidy Findomestic Banca.... because it is very messy and everything is wet on board. I am still sailing without automatic pilot, the light ahead of the boat doesn't work anymore, I will try to mend it as soon as possible. It should take me about ten days to arrive at the Canary Islands and I am going to make my boat work hard to get there as soon as possible'*

Alessandro Di Benedetto has just managed to face the first difficulty of his voyage and let's say it again on the smallest boat that has ever faced the ocean for such a hard challenge.

Alessandro will be on air, live, every Monday at 7.15 p.m. with Caterpillar on the waves of Radio 2 animated by Massimo Cirri. In Italian, of course !!!!
